Vilnius University Open Science Policy



Vilnius University Open Science Policy Guidelines

Article 12. The University **aims to make** the University's scientific (artistic) works and final study projects **publicly accessible** <...>.

Article 13. It is recommended that, when choosing open access for publishing and/or releasing University's scientific (artistic) works, **preference be given to pure open access journals** that ensure high quality of research results, appropriate levels of peer review, and have a significant impact on the development and dissemination of science. <...>.



Article 1.1.1. Update of the University's open access to scientific (artistic) works and final study project regulations <...>. 100% of scientific publications financed by national and European research councils and public grants from the University budget should be accessible through open access.

Article 1.1.2. Establishment of a **funding procedure for open access publishing articles and books**.



Current Regulations

Vilnius University Regulations on Intellectual Property Management

Article 6.3. The intellectual property rights to textbooks, literature, scientific works (monographs, research articles, conference abstracts, presentations, book chapters, scientific data, or datasets, and similar creations), as well as works of art, belong to the University employees who created them, unless otherwise specified in a copyright or other agreement, or if the creation of these works was not commissioned and funded by the University in a specific case.



Addendum of Typical Publication Agreement at Vilnius University

Article 4. Author's Retention of Rights. **Notwithstanding any terms in the Publication Agreement to the contrary**, Author and Publisher agree that in addition to any rights under copyright retained by Author in the Publication Agreement, **Author retains**:

- (i) the rights to reproduce, to distribute, to publicly perform, and to publicly display the Article in any medium for noncommercial purposes;
- (ii) the right to prepare derivative works from the Article; and
- (iii) the right to authorize others to make any non-commercial use of the Article so long as Author receives credit as author and the journal in which the Article has been published is cited as the source of first publication of the Article.



Further Implementation of Rights Retention Strategy



Rights Retention Objectives at Vilnius University

- To guarantee open access without embargo, utilizing a CC BY license, and accessibility through a repository for all scientific publications funded by national and European research councils, as well as public grants from the University budget.
- To guarantee that researchers with the aforementioned funding have the continued **flexibility to publish in a diverse range of journals**, and to **provide the means** for these researchers to **retain sufficient rights** for the reuse of their work according to their preferences.
